Conditions for participation

Condition 1: Eligibility

Condition 2: Conglomerates

Condition 3: Quality of proposed Brussels sessions

Condition 4: Quality of proposed local events

Condition 5: **Providing of Technical data**



Most important points:

- Regions must have a regional office in Brussels
- As a general rule, cities must have a regional office in Brussels or must be a capital of a country or NUTS I or NUTS II region or must have more than 500.000 inhabitants
- 8-12 partners within the conglomerate, where 5 different countries are represented
- One single venue per conglomerate (1 or 2 sessions)
- One lead office and one deputy office for the conglomerate
- Each partner has to organise a local event
- One contact person on behalf of the conglomerate responsible for local events
- More time for preparation of applications we expect higher quality
