



## **RIO+20 – THE MAYORS SUMMIT**

Forte de Copacabana, Rio de Janeiro, June 17th – June 19th



Prominent world mayors and local government leaders together with organizations such as C40 Cities Climate Leadership Group, UCLG, UN-Habitat and Metropolis will debate and showcase their policies towards sustainable development. The event will be held prior to the Heads of State Summit on Rio+20 and will consist of mayors' roundtables, technical meetings and exhibitions of practices to promote good urban development, paths to a greener economy, poverty eradication and climate change mitigation and adaptation strategies.

The Summit will be held at Copacabana Fort, a landmark heritage site at the tip of renowned Copacabana Beach. An iconic venue is being built for this event by the Federations of Industries of Rio de Janeiro and São Paulo and Roberto Marinho Foundation with the support of the City of Rio de Janeiro.

Building on the preparatory meetings held in New York in April, UCLG and UN-Habitat with the support of Cities Alliance and UNACLA under the auspices of the City of Rio will bring together over 250 Local and Regional Governments representatives to discuss their contributions to the Summit.

In New-York, before the UN Secretary General, Ban Ki Moon, Member States and other stakeholders, local and sub-national authorities transmitted a sense of urgency: the need to act is now.

They called for concrete actions and measurable commitments and results. They expressed the wish to work towards a « green society » moving from global governance to multi-level governance and defining strategies to achieve the Millennium Development Goals and Sustainable Development Goals with the Habitat III conference in 2016 as important milestone.

This event will give all invited stakeholders the opportunity to further elaborate on those ideas through dedicated roundtables, and to start developing or strengthening collaborative ways to implement the 8 recommendations made in view of Rio+20 and its aftermath.
